

## **ELIGIBILITY & REQUIREMENTS**

- 1. Family must be members of the Tompkins FFA Booster Club as many years as the child was in FFA, minimum of 3 years active FFA membership.
- 2. Full time student pursuing a degree or certification at any 2- or 4-year University/College or Trade school.
- 3. Member of Tompkins FFA in their senior year.
- 4. Be a current year graduating senior.
- 5. Must submit FFA LDE, CDE and volunteer participation.
  - a. Projects
  - b. Leadership
  - c. Citizenship & Community Service
- Conduct in senior year: No Unsatisfactory, no suspensions and no more than two (2) Needs Improvement in school or out of school.
- 7. Be a US Citizen and a residence of the State of Texas
- Submit a written 500-600 word essay describing your experiences with agriculture / FFA, the impact that agriculture / FFA has had on you / your family, and how it will affect your future.
- If required, participate in a face-to-face interview with Tompkins FFA Booster Club scholarship subcommittee. A standard list of interview questions are available. (Using state FFA interview questions.)
- 10. All scholarship recipients are expected to be PRESENT in Official FFA dress at the Tompkins awards banquet (dinner and ceremony) to receive a Tompkins FFA Booster Club scholarship. Tompkins FFA banquet is May 10, 2023
- All applications must be turned into an FFA teacher or Booster Club officer by April 24, 2023. Interviews will be conducted in early May if necessary.

Subcommittee will score applicants as follows:

- 1. 50% Chapter/State Involvement
- 2. 40% Written Essay
- 3. 10% References
- 4. Face-to-Face Interview if applicants are close in scores
- 5. GPA may be considered if applicants are close in scores

Subcommittee will present scholarship recipient recommendations to the full booster club showing rankings of all applicants.

- 1. Two (2) letters of reference from people other than members of your family. One of the letters must be from a core subject teacher (Science, History, English or Math). One letter must be from someone outside of school.
- 2. An essay of 500-600 words describing your experiences with agriculture / FFA, the impact that agriculture / FFA has had on you / your family, and how it will affect your future.
